1. Regardless of individual course grades, students must maintain a minimum 2.000 cumulative GPA.
2. Some colleges require a minimum GPA for major courses. Courses indicated in this column are included in the major GPA for this program of study.
3. Students in the Classical Studies concentration are required to demonstrate proficiency in either the Greek or Latin language equivalent to the 122 course through course credit or the corresponding foreign language placement score. Students who test into LATN 109 will need an additional semester of the language to reach the 122 level.
4. The [Carolina Core](#) provides the common core of knowledge, skill and academic experience for all Carolina undergraduate students.
5. The McCausland College of Arts and Sciences requires one U.S. History and one non-U.S. History course, both of which must be chosen from the approved Carolina Core GHS courses. Whichever is not fulfilled through the Carolina Core GHS requirement must be fulfilled through this college requirement.
6. The cognate is intended to support the course work in the major. The cognate must consist of twelve hours of courses at the advanced level, outside of, but related to the major. In place of a cognate, a student may choose a minor consisting of at least 18 credit hours of courses concentrated in one area that follow a structured sequence. A second major eliminates the minor/cognate requirement.
7. **Classics-Classical Studies Program Electives (12 hours):** ARTH 313, 320, 514, 520, 524; CLAS 240, 301, 302, 305, 320, 321, 323, 324, 325, 340, 350, 360, 361, 370, 371, 372, 373, 380, 381, 401, 469; CPLT 301; HIST 302, 303, 304, 325; PHIL 505, 506, 526; RELG 302, 310, 311, 312, 315, 316, 410. Courses with appropriate content, such as Special Topics courses, may be applied with permission of the advisor.
8. No courses of a remedial, developmental, skill-acquiring, or vocational nature may apply as credit toward degrees in the McCausland College of Arts and Sciences. The McCausland College of Arts and Sciences allows the use of the Pass-Fail option on elective courses. Further clarification on inapplicable courses can be obtained from the McCausland College of Arts and Sciences.

Program Notes:

- Courses identified as "critical" must be completed in the student's first 60 semester hours of work in order for these courses to be credited toward graduation.
- All undergraduate students must take a 3-credit course or its equivalent with a passing grade that covers the founding documents. This course may fulfill any requirement in the program of study. Courses that meet this requirement are listed in the academic [bulletin](#).
- The last 30 credit hours toward your degree must be earned in residence at the University of South Carolina-Columbia.
